GET NALOXONE NOW

WHAT IS NALOXONE/ NARCAN?

 Naloxone is a medication that can prevent overdose by temporarily stopping the effect of opioids (ie. Heroin, Fentanyl, Codeine, Oxycodone, Methadone, etc.) by allowing breathing to resume and reversing the overdose

HOW TO REVERSE OVERDOSE WITH NALOXONE

- When someone is unresponsive, call 911.
- Administer Naloxone. Insert nasal Naloxone into the nostril and spray. If using intramuscular Naloxone, draw up dose and inject into upper arm or thigh muscle.
- If no response in 3 minutes, give a second dose, if available.
- Do rescue breathing until help arrives.

WHERE CAN I GET NALOXONE?

- You can get Naloxone through local health providers and pharmacies or for free at HIV Alliance Syringe Exchange operations at 647 W. Luellen Dr, Suite 103, Roseburg, OR.

 "Good Sam" protects you and the person overdosing from being prosecuted for: 1. Possessing drugs /drug paraphernalia, 2. Being in a place where drugs are used, 3. Violating probation or parole, or having outstanding warrants related to #1 or #2 above.
