## 2025 SHARE Investment Summary

### **SHARE Overview**

SHARE stands for Supporting Health for All through Reinvestment. Oregon requires coordinated care organizations, called CCOs, to reinvest part of their profits into the communities they serve. These funds support community health by investing in needs such as housing, food, transportation, and access to services. This summary highlights Umpqua Health Alliance's 2025 SHARE investments.

In 2025, Umpqua Health Alliance invested \$1.2 million in community projects across Douglas County through the SHARE program. These investments support healthier families, better access to services, safer community spaces, and stronger local infrastructure. An additional \$400,000 was reserved for future community needs.

### **Why this matters for Douglas County**

These investments help address everyday needs that affect health and quality of life in our community. They support more stable housing, better access to food and recreation, improved accessibility, and stronger shared spaces for families and residents across Douglas County.

### **SHARE Investment Process**

#### Priority areas

The SHARE spending plan aligns with our Community Health

Improvement Plan and supports four priority areas identified through data review and community input from Douglas County residents, partners, and local stakeholders.

- **Families and Children:** Support for children and families, including help with basic needs and school success
- **Social Determinants of Health:** Investments in housing, transportation, food, and essential services
- **Healthy Lifestyles:** Access to nutrition, physical activity, and prevention programs
- **Behavioral Health and Addictions:** Mental health services, prevention, treatment, and community based support

#### Partner selection and community advisory council (CAC) role

UHA used a community based review process to select 2025 SHARE investments.

1. **Funding announcement:** UHA announced up to \$1.6 million in SHARE funding and shared application information with community organizations.
2. **Applications received:** Organizations submitted proposals describing the project, expected community benefit, and long term sustainability.
3. **Review and scoring:** UHA's Community team reviewed applications using a scoring rubric approved by the Community Advisory Council, or CAC.
4. **Leadership review:** UHA leadership reviewed applications, scores, and funding recommendations.

5. **Board decision:** The UHA Board of Directors made final funding decisions based on community priorities and SHARE requirements.
6. **Awards announced:** Final awards were shared with community partners.

The Community Advisory Council, or CAC, helped guide the SHARE process. The CAC approved the application and scoring rubric, reviewed updates from funded partners, and provided feedback on funding recommendations. This helped ensure community voice was part of the process.

<b>Roseburg School District</b>	Gym access system for community use	\$40,000	More community access to school gyms for youth and local programs outside school hours.
