What is the SHARE?

SHARE Defined: Supporting Health for All through Reinvestment Initiative

1

SHARE (Supporting Health for All through Reinvestment) is a program established by the Oregon Health Authority that requires Coordinated Care Organizations (CCOs) to reinvest a portion of their net income back into their communities. The goal is to address **health equity**, **social determinants of health**, and improve overall well-being by funding **community-driven projects** that create lasting impact.



How much funding is available?

2

Funding availability varies each grant cycle. In 2026, UHA will invest a total of \$1.6 million to support projects that are in our service area.



What is the timeline for applying?

3

- Request for application opens: July 1
- Applications due: July 31
- Award announcements: By September 31
- Funding distributed: Before December 31



What are the requirements of SHARE?

Projects must align with the **Community Health Improvement Plan** and spending must fall within one of the five domains of Social Determinants of Health & Equity (SDOH-E):

- Economic Stability
- Neighborhood and Built Environment
- Education
- Social & Community Health
- Health Care Access & Quality



What are the key requirements for a successful application?

A strong application should: Clearly align with CHP strategies, demonstrate measurable community impact, show collaboration with other organizations, include a well-defined budget & sustainability plan
